The Assessor’s Office has been hard at work due to the recent growth in Union County. We have seen increases in residential property values, growth in the commercial property area, and many instances of new families coming to our area from all over the country.

Community Development: Kathy Jo Lancaster

Transportation:

- Launched a *Rural Transportation Service in January 2023* through partnerships with The Connector, Chester County Senior Services, and the South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT).
- Offering mobility and accessibility to medical appointments, grocery stores, pharmacies, general shopping, school, and work. Within three weeks of operations, the five-mile service area expanded to include the Towns of Carlisle, Jonesville, and Lockhart. Over 75% of the daily trips are employees commuting to work in Union County businesses.
- SCDOT approved State Mass Transit Funding for Union County. This three-year pilot program provides up to \$150,000 per year with Union County's 50% match.
- In the 1st seven months, over 1,200 passengers have used the services, travelling approximately 5,000 passenger miles making a positive impact on the mobility and quality of life for all Union County citizens.

Broadband:

- Union County and Spectrum received 11.7 million broadband Infrastructure Grant
- The broadband buildout will provide high speed, reliable, and affordable internet to rural areas currently without the service capabilities.
- Funds will build out 54 miles of fiber, to approximately 1,198 locations in Union County.

County Comprehensive Plan

- The Planning commission continues to work in areas related to the County's approved comprehensive plan with citizens and stakeholders
 - Continued collaboration with citizens on land use planning
 - Board members completed required education and training
 - Working on connectivity network of green space to assist with vibrant, healthy and resilient communities.
 - Continued support of a 5,500-acre lake project in Union County
 - Working in conjunction and in support with Tourism on rebranding of John D. Long Lake project.

Health and Wellness

- Community Development was awarded a \$90,000 grant through SC Department of Public Safety to purchase PPE, medical supplies, and technical equipment in prevention efforts relating to the spread of Covid-19 at the Union County Detention Center.
- SC DHEC provided funding and collected Union County data in key health data points as part of the Community's Health Plan. The five-year plan was completed in Q4 2022 by the Live Healthy Union Task Force. Union County Community Development provided input and assistance in development of the document.

- Represented Union on “Factors that Affect Health” sub-committee which falls under oversight of the Live Healthy Union Taskforce.

Community Relations:

National Night Out

National Night Out (<https://natw.org/>) is an annual community-building campaign that promotes police-community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie to make our neighborhoods safer, more caring places to live. National Night Out enhances the relationship between neighbors and law enforcement while bringing back a true sense of community. Furthermore, it provides a great opportunity to bring police and neighbors together under positive circumstances.

Starbucks has partnered with the Union County Sheriff's Office and Union Public Safety Department to host the National Night Out event this year. On August 1, 2023, Starbucks will be providing free brewed coffee from 4-6 PM. UCSO and UPSD will be present and available to speak with citizens and visitors in an open conversation about concerns or compliments they may have regarding the service in their communities.

Pops with Cops

Our vision for Cops with Pops is very similar to Coffee with a Cop. The main difference is we would be targeting the youth in the community, along with adults. We would bring popsicles to a location in their community, hand them out without expectations, and engage them in conversation. These events would be primarily during the summer months. We have already purchased a freezer to store and transport the popsicles. The primary expense is the recurring cost of purchasing replacement popsicles.

School Supply Giveaway

The 3rd Annual School Supply Giveaway was held July 29th at the Union County Fairgrounds. The Sheriff's Office partnered with local businesses and community members for donations. In the first year, the Sheriff's Office provided 100 backpacks with school supplies to youth in need in order to help them be successful in school by providing supplies such as a backpack, pencils, pens, highlighters, paper, composition books, colored pencils, and crayons. The second year, in conjunction with Greater

Union Church, and Union Public Safety we were able to provide 550 backpacks filled with school supplies. This year, along with Greater Union Church and Union Public Safety, we hope to surpass a goal of 750 backpacks and provide a meal to each student.
